The turners have been put effort into creating a series of short power point presentations which they have been going over at their group meetings. Not everyone will use all equipment and hence needs to be certified in its' use. However, our aim is to increase everyone's skills and to identify those members who are certified when you want to put a piece of wood through a machine.

A number of our members have been afflicted by this unpleasant RSV virus and been staying away from group meetings. I particularly want to express our appreciation that you have taken this proactive step to protect others.

The theme of the 2021 show is the promotion of wood working as a hobbyist activity and recruitment of new members. We plan to do this by increasing the space and number of live demonstrations we have running by each of the different groups to show the public our craft activities. We want to invite the public to come along and discuss any projects they want to do, or skills they wish to learn. However, a prime objective is also to try and grow the Guild's membership. If you have any ideas on this theme would you please discuss with Greg Taylor or your group leaders.

Allan Curtis has volunteered to be the lead organiser for the 2021 Show's Exhibition area where we display items of our best work. In previous years we asked members to submit work done within the past two years. However, in 2021 we have decided to widen the entry criterion and invite everyone to select items of work you are most proud of making, irrespective of when it was made, for inclusion in this year's Exhibition. Monthly Meeting Talks: Each group takes it in turns to be on duty at a monthly meeting and to organise a group talk on a topic of interest. For example at our July 2021 monthly meeting we were entertained by a talk from a visitor, Arthur King, on making snooker cues. Arthur is a world snooker coach based in Tauranga. He has been making and selling snooker cues for many years. The monthly talk was arranged by our turning group for the July meeting, and despite the abysmal weather on Saturday we had a very lively presentation and follow up discussion with Arthur. His only "must" for the whole afternoon was that while he would show us his cue, "no-one was allowed to touch it" even his wife.

Funding Application 2021: We understand the Lions Foundation met in mid July and reviewed our 2021 funding application for money to upgrade the AV system in the workshop, for two additional scroll saws and to purchase a AED for the workshop. Their funding decisions will be ratified on July 26th and we hope to be advised on their decision shortly after this.

Group Activities

Group 1: Woodcarvers

2nd and 4th Monday of the month. 9:30am - 3:00pm.

Phil had had a break from the carving group activities and was down in the South Island attending an excellent two day knife making workshop run by Shane Minnear at the Geraldine Forge & Blades workshop. <u>https://www.facebook.com/288232794703556/posts/1575545169305639/</u>

Phil produced two wood carving knives starting from some scrap car spring steel while his two companions worked on separate projects of their own. Shane has his own forge and also a 75 tonne pneumatic hammer in his workshop, which takes the effort out of hammering large pieces of steel. He took the group through the processes of forging, normalising, annealing, quenching and tempering, before making handles and sharpening the finished blades. It was a great day and recommended to anyone planning a South Island trip and interested in trying something new.

Meanwhile back in the workshop, the other members of our Carving Group continued working on various bird, fish, animal and foliage carving projects. Chris was doing a relief carving of some oak leaves and acorns celebrating the surname of his partner, while Tom and Gavin worked on relief carvings of some

flowers. Our newest carving group member, Linda, was busy with a dolphin carving that is our usual starter projects for first time wood carvers. John was working on his 3rd relief carving of an eagle (the others having been claimed by family members), Jean was shaping two members of a flock of small birds for a wall hanging, Barwick had a full size goose carving which is keeping him busy, while Phil returned from knife making to continue with a new owl carving he is doing from black walnut. A carving of a bullock has been started by Ivan. Geoff was working on a wood spirit carving and Grant was carving a model dinghy with his usual precision and care.

For carvings that are intended for outdoor settings, Barwick (based on his boat building experience) only uses Sikkens Cetol HLSe - which is a transparent wood finish. Sikkens specialise in outdoor timber finishes. Barwick feels it provides is the longest lasting of any product for the outdoors.

The sharing of knowledge at the carvers meetings through these informal training sessions has been appreciated by everyone.
