THE PRESIDENT'S PAPERS

Members Welfare: To all our members who are unwell, or are recovering from illness, our thoughts are with you and we all wish you a speedy recovery.

Covid: From December 3rd, 2021 NZ is moving to the new COVID-19 protection framework (traffic light system). The NZ Government has yet to advise what setting will apply to Tauranga (Red, Orange or Green). The way that members can continue to use the Tauranga Woodcrafters workshop will be directed by that setting, plus the restrictions applicable in the traffic light system with respect to the use of 'My Vaccine Pass'.

Irrespective of debate over the science & merits of vaccinations, the fact is that the introduction of the traffic light system means members who are not double vaccinated, and not holding a vaccination pass, will encounter increasing restrictions on what you can do across multiple facets of your lives. The fundamental decision for the Guild is whether we will restrict entry to group meetings to those members who hold a current vaccination pass (i.e. to those who are double vaccinated). The impact of this decision is that it will limit group meeting sizes as summarised below.

If we do use vaccination passes:

Under Red traffic light – gatherings are limited to 100 people Under Orange traffic light – gatherings are unlimited Under Green traffic light – gatherings are unlimited

If we **don't** use vaccination passes:

Under Red traffic light – gatherings are limited to 10 people Under Orange traffic light – gatherings are limited to 50 people Under Green traffic light – gatherings are limited to 100 people

Under these rules Group meeting sizes are restricted to the numbers indicated above. Currently our Guild is operating without using vaccination passes to restrict entry. This would mean that group sizes would be reduced, depending on the traffic light colour applicable to Tauranga. As from December 3rd, Group Leaders will need to close the doors and turn away people when the specified number is reached. At Red we may need to close the workshop.

The committee has elected to defer any decision to impose a restriction on member attendance until the government issues a clear direction on how the recently announced Vaccine Passes are to be managed. There is as yet no formal system in place to verify validity of passes that may be presented. Accordingly this means members are free to decide whether or not to attend workshops (with possible limits on numbers attending). The committee will continue to monitor this evolving situation in coming weeks and will advise members of any change which may affect member attendance at workshops or Guild meetings. The next full Guild meeting is not scheduled until January 15th 2022 and we expect to have a clearer guide for members before that meeting.

Once again I note that the Committee encourages all members to get vaccinated against the Covid-19 virus. We take this stance because of the age of the majority of our members, and their health risks. We recognise that vaccination is a personal decision. However, we sincerely believe it is the only defence we have against overwhelming the NZ hospital system with Covid patients and thereby wiping out the capacity of that system to deal with other types of medical emergency requiring ICU facilities.

Furthermore, Members must stay home if sick, feeling unwell, or have visited a listed place of interest where a Covid infectious person has been. Get yourself assessed if you have any symptoms of Covid-19. Don't come to any meetings in the workshop until you recover, or are cleared by an assessment test.

Members Training Register: A while ago I flagged that Group Leaders have been asked by the Committee to start running members attending their individual groups through training in the safe operation of the powered machinery in our workshop.

The Committee has agreed to use the Safe Operating Procedures, which have been written and published by the National Association of Woodworkers, for this purpose. We have also introduced a training register sheet for each member where the Group Leaders can sign-off with the member that training on specific machinery has been completed.

Relevant training will be given as applicable to a group's activities. For example, if you don't need to use the router you don't need to receive training in using the router. However, this also means that if you have a task requiring use of the router, that task needs to be carried out for you by the Group Leader or someone who has had the training.

So, members only need to obtain power equipment training for the Guild's machines you want to use. However, no member may use an item of powered equipment until you complete training in that machine and jointly sign off completion of that training in the register with an approved trainer. The list of approved trainers includes; Group Leaders plus Greg Taylor, Mike Buck, Michael McCarthy, and Roy Tregilgas. The Register will be held in the book case in the lunch room.

2022 Show: I want to remind everyone that we have registered with the BOP Garden and Arts Festival for our 2022 November show to be included as one of the destinations. Greg Taylor is underway with our planning for that event which will become our major fund raiser for 2022. We are asking all members to think about how we can lift our efforts to new heights in promoting the Guild's activities & members work.

Guild Secretary: Alan Sciascia has advised me that he wants to stand down from the committee, no later than the AGM in May 2022. I welcome anyone who might be interested in taking over the Secretary's position to let me know please.

Christmas Break: There will not be a full Guild meeting in December 2021. The next full Guild monthly meeting will be in Saturday January 15th at 1:30pm when the Turners will be on duty. The Committee is tentatively planning to have a BBQ lunch and social occasion at the full Guild meeting on February 19th, 2022. Finally, I wish you a very Merry Christmas, happy New Year and all the best for the holidays.

Another thing to report is that we have recently purchased a set of SaburTooth burrs, Diamond burrs & milling cutters for the Guild's Dremel units for power carving work.

The carvers will have their last meeting for 2021 on Monday December 13th. This will include a pot luck lunch. We plan to resume the carving group meetings on Monday January 10th of 2022.
