Guild AGM News: Our 2023 AGM was held on May 20th with the election of a new committee for 2023/24. We had an attendance of 34 members, and 7 apologies. Your new committee is Phil Hansen (President), Greg Taylor (VP), Louisa Allwood (Secretary), Margaret Dekker (Treasurer), Tony Phillips (Committee), Colin King (Committee), Jenny Bowker (Newsletter Editor-outside committee).

The following members stood down from the 2022/23 committee; Glenn Whittaker, Frazer Pengelly, Lawson Worsnop and Allan Curtis. A vote of thanks was given to all of the retiring members for their outstanding contribution to the Guild's operation. Your group coordinators are; Duncan Campbell for the Scroll Saw group, Phil Hansen for the Carvers, Greg Taylor and Tony Phillips for the Turners, Mike Buck and Roy Tregilgas for the Thursday Wood Preparation group, Bill Wilson and Hob Thompson for the Open workshop group. Tony Phillips takes over from Lawson Worsnop as our maintenance officer. Michael McCarthy continues as our wood officer. Louisa Allwood is our caretaker supplies officer. We still need someone to volunteer to fill the role of librarian.

Members voted at the 2023 AGM and approved motions to:

- a. Increase full adult membership subscriptions from \$75 to \$100 per annum (\$10 discount for NAW membership to apply).
- b. To approve an Expense budget of \$8,800 for 2023/23
- c. To give the Committee approval to authorise payments to Service Providers up to the amounts defined in the approved 2023/24 Expenses Budget without the need to return to a full Guild meeting for approval when any individual payment defined in the budget exceeds \$500.
- d. To approve the draw down of Capital Reserves by up to \$6,000 during 2023/24 for the purpose of major equipment replacement / upgrade work.
- e. To form a subcommittee of P. Hansen, G. Whittaker and G. Webber to negotiate an extension of the Guild's existing workshop site lease with the Tauranga City Council.
- f. To form a subcommittee of P. Hansen, G. Taylor, D. St George and G. Webber to prepare and then apply to register a new Constitution for the Guild in compliance with the Incorporated Societies 2022 Act.

Group Changes for 2023/24: The following changes have been made to group meeting times going forward from the AGM.

- a. Carving Group will now meet every Monday at 9:30am from June 5th 2023
- b. Turners will meet every Tuesday at 9:30am.
- c. Open Workshop is changing from Wednesday and will now meet on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday evenings of the month at 6:00pm. They will also continue their meetings on 2nd and 4th Saturdays of each month at 9:30am.
- d. The Thursday Wood Preparation group will meet every Thursday at 9:30am.
- e. The scroll saw group have no changes to their meeting program.





Working within limitations

I have a garage workshop which limits me to storing my workshop tools at the end or sides of my garage. One of my machines is a thicknesser, which weighs 30kg, and I have had to haul it out from under my workbench and then lift it up on to my folding Bosch workbench to allow me to machine any boards. This is now too challenging and I have had to devise a better solution. The stand had to be stable when in use, stow away neatly against the wall, be easily wheeled to where it is needed and lifted up by one person. 
Group Activities

We had our nine core attendees again this month. The articles they were producing illustrated their increased improvement in the skills of shaping and finishing to produce aesthetically pleasing pieces.

Some wood blanks that look good at the start can reveal some unnerving cracks when going from rough blanks to rounds and further shaped articles. This month it happened to a couple of the turners, and the more experienced turners were able to offer solutions to the problem in the way of reshaping, rather than filling the cracks with epoxy glue.

Finishing came under the spotlight also with different turners learning about the different properties of native and exotic woods when trying to eliminate scratch marks before applying a polish; sometimes a frustrating and tedious exercise!
