

Equipment wear and tear

If you are thinking about using painted timber, please use a sander first to remove all paint from the surface of timber **BEFORE** you put it through the saws, buzzer or thicknesser in our workshop.

Paint takes the edge of cutters, blunts them and ruins the tools for the rest of us!

Saw dust is toxic

Any sanding job which produces sawdust has the potential to increase the incidence of nasal cancer, respiratory cancer, skin irritation, eczema, rashes, running nose, sneezing, eye irritation, conjunctivitis, breathlessness, wheezing, & asthma.

Some woods are more hazardous than others and these include; Ash, Beech, Black Walnut, Jarrah, Kahikatea, Mahogany, Oak, Olive, Rimu, Robinia, Silky Oak, Tawa, & Teak.

Doing sanding jobs inside the workshop affects us all.


- Wear a breathing mask WHEREVER you do a sanding job.
- Do sanding jobs outdoors,
- OR use a wet sanding method. Wet sanding is the process of using something like water or WD-40 while sanding to capture the sawdust particles as a slurry and stop them from spreading through the air we all breathe.

Please consider others and either use wet sanding, or take your job outside, sand it on the deck and always wear a breathing mask to protect yourself.



The Open workshop has become so busy now Bill needs an assistant. Let Bill know if you can help.


Remember that the workshop is on every second and fourth Saturday of the month.
