Notice of Special General Meeting

Notice is hereby given for a Special General Meeting to be held for the Tauranga Woodcrafters Association on Saturday 21 February 2026 at the clubrooms 3 Cherokee Place Commencing 1:30pm

A quorum is required comprising 20% of the current financial members. If you can't attend a proxy may be provided to a Committee member in person or by emailing the club advising such

The items to be addressed at the meeting are :

1. Set budget and membership fees for the year commencing 1 April 2026, and
2. Amend clause 8.1 of the constitution to create a smaller Finance Committee for operating the Guild's bank accounts and to transact the financial affairs of the Guild. This change is necessary as the Bank interpretation of the existing clause means that for any change to authorities to operate accounts, add, delete signatories all members of the Committee must sign the necessary paperwork and as necessary provide proof of id etc etc. Following last years change to the executive it took us 6 months to make the necessary changes through the bank - a situation not really tenable for future committees
3. Amend clause 5.7 so that the frequency of Committee meetings shall be a minimum of two monthly (currently monthly). This is ample for a club of this size and the Committee can quickly be called together to consider any matters that need attention

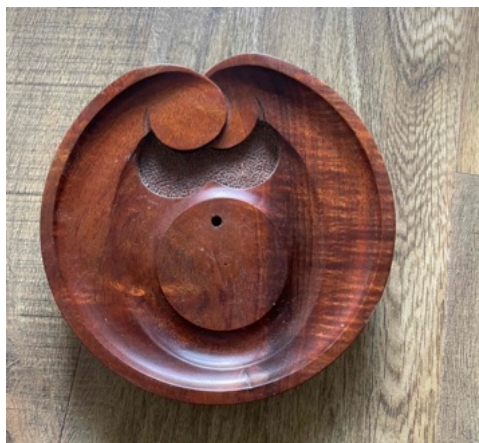
Full details on these matters will be sent out next week (hopefully)

Activities



Wood turning and then carving the sustainability award plaques in accordance with Derek Kerwood design instructions, has occupied a number of hours over the summer break. We bought a slab of kiln dry black walnut (as recommended by Derek) for the 11 regional award plaques and used copper beech for the National award. We created a special makers logo and Trevor Martin kindly used his laser burner to print this onto the back of each plaque to keep Derek's memory with the plaques.



The Public Art Omokoroa recently advised that they have finally installed a new wall carving in their library. Our Guild has carved three items for this piece of work (the 3 baskets of Tane). A local Maori carver, Pete Smith, has carved a Waharoa (the gateway) to sit above the baskets with a design representing the heavens. Public Art Omokoroa hopes to have a formal opening and unveiling in late January or early February.
